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Remains of second fisherman recovered from Housatonic River

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NEW MILFORD, Conn. (AP) — The body of the second person reported missing this week in Connecticut has been pulled from the Housatonic River, according to New Milford Mayor Pete Bass.

Two Danbury fishermen went missing Wednesday after falling into the river near Bleachery Dam, [the News-Times reported](#).

A witness told authorities that one man slipped off of the dam and the second fell in while attempting to reach him.

Bass said in a Facebook post that the individual's remains were pulled from the river on Saturday.

“(P)lease keep your thoughts and prayers for those that passed and their families,” he wrote.

Authorities have not released the names of the men, ages 23 and 36.

Bass said Friday that the 23-year-old man's remains had been recovered.

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
