Woman feared drowned



Rescue crews arrived at the Black Rock Dam shortly before 2 p.m. and started to search for the 36-year-old woman, whose identity was being withheld by police.

"There was a male, a female and a dog in a boat above the dam," said Upper Providence Police Cpl. Robert Ward. "The dog jumped in, and the female jumped in after the dog. Apparently, she couldn't get back to the boat."

The man in the boat, identified only as the victim's boyfriend, threw an orange flotation device to the woman, who was not wearing a life vest, rescuers said. The woman grabbed the flotation device just before she was carried over the dam.

"She was last seen going over the dam," Ward said.

forced to cancel their efforts at about 7:30 p.m. because of the turbulence of the water, according to Ward.

"We had the heavy divers in, but the water under the dam is too turbulent, so they're pulling out," Ward said.

Oaks Fire Company Deputy Chief Joe Locasale was coordinating the effort from Lock 60.

"We have crews searching the banks on both sides of the river from Black Rock to the Route 29 bridge," Locasale said.

As the afternoon hours faded, rescuers continued to arrive and relieve exhausted volunteers from Mont Clare, Oaks, Spring-Ford and Phoenixville departments. Using dive units and thermal cameras, Locasale planned a search of a logjam at the head of a small dirt island below the dam. Similar islands dot the river throughout its length, all potential snagging points for a drowning victim.

Locasale said the flotation device should have been enough to support the woman. Still diminished by the drought, the river level was below normal, and the current was not unusually strong, according to Locasale. But there

Ward said the operation was no longer being considered a rescue.
